## Block 25/25 Summer Rose

One Hundred Eighty-Two Day Solstice Challenge Hosted by Pat Sloan At Ilovetomakequilts.com

You did it!! Block 25 of 25... a bed size quilt top sewn in just 182 days... with a few more days left to do the sashings and catch up! I have had a BLAST doing this and can't wait to do the next one starting June 28, 2017.

I'm ending the Solstice with a Summer Rose, the traditional Rosebud pieced block. Pink roses are my mom's favorite flower, and I grow wild roses in red.

SQUARE Block to 12.5" x 12.5" Finished in the guilt is Size 12"

This is also one of the first blocks I used in an early quilt pattern design for my company. You can use multiple fabrics or just 2, it is fantastic either way.

The Layout is at my website on the Solstice page. There is also a place to share a photo of your full quilt! Now to think about a narrow border to frame the quilt. If you decide to do 'Quilt as You Go' use the setting layout to quilt it in sections! Thank you for joining me, see you for the next one!

The Solstice challenge spans 182 days between the winter and summer Solstice this year. We'll be making a quilt with 25 blocks... and Somewhere along this journey I'll give you a setting.

## **Cutting & Sewing**

### **Light Fabric**

- Cut 4 squares 3" x 3" for HST
- Cut 2 squares 5" x 5" for HST
- Cut 4 rectangles 2.5" x 6.5"

#### **Medium Fabric**

Cut 4 squares 3" x 3" for HST

### **Dark Fabric**

Cut 2 squares 5" x 5" for HST

### **Directions**

1) Sew the 3" medium and light squares Using HST method on last page.

Make 8 units - trim to 2.5" square



2) Sew the 5" dark and light squares Using HST method on last page. Make 4 units - trim to 4.5" square









### **Directions**


3) Following the diagram Sew 2 Medium HST units together Make 4
Measures 2.5" x 4.5"



4) Following the diagram Sew a Dark/light HST to a unit from above Make 4
Measures 4.5" x 6.5"



5) Following the diagram sew the rectangle to the unit above. Make 4 Measures 6.5" x 6.5"





6) Following the diagram on the next page Sew the 4 blocks together rotating the placement






## Square the Block to 12.5" x 12.5"


### **Half Square Triangles Tutorial**

NOTE- For other ways to make HST units, see my book "Pat Sloan's Teach Me to Sew Triangles"




Step 1

- Draw a line on the back of all the lighter squares



Step 2

- Layer the 2 squares
- Sew a ¼" seam on both Sides of the drawn line



Step 3

Cut on the drawn Line for 2 HST




- -Trim small squares to 2.5" x 2.5" using a square ruler with a diagonal line placed on the Seam.
- Trim large squares to 4.5" x 4.5"
