## Supply List

Blue Plaid - 16" x wof

Red with Dots - 10" x wof

Snowmen - 33" x wof

Charcoal plaid - 25" x wof (also used for binding)

Red herringbone - 17" x wof

Snowflake border - 28" x wof

## CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Blue Plaid

-cut 9 squares 4" x 4"

-cut 2 inner borders 1.5" x 38.5"

-cut 2 inner borders 1.5" x 36.5"

Red Dots

-cut 18 squares 4" x 4"

Snowmen

-cut 36 squares 3.5" x 3.5"

-cut 36 squares 4" x 4"

Charcoal Plaid

-cut 27 squares 4" x 4"

Red herringbone

-cut 18 squares 4" x 4"

-cut 4 squares 6.5" x 6.5"

Snowflake border

-cut 4 borders 6.5" x 38.5"



## SEWING DIRECTIONS

Let's make the half Square triangle units first! I like to make oversized units from squares.

If you have never used this method, see the last page of the pattern.

-Pair all the Blue Plaid squares with a Red herringbone square. Trim each to 3.5" x 3.5".  
Make 18 hst units with these fabrics.

-Pair 9 Charcoal Plaid squares with a Red Herringbone square. Trim each to 3.5" x 3.5".  
Make 18 hst units with these fabrics.

-Pair the remaining Charcoal Plaid squares with a 4" Snowman square. Trim each to 3.5" x 3.5".  
Make 36 hst units with these fabrics.

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## SEWING DIRECTIONS Continued from page 1

-Pair all the Red dot squares with a 4" Snowman square. Trim each to 3.5" x 3.5". Make 36 hst units with these fabrics.

All your HST units are now ready.

## BLOCK DIRECTIONS

Sew 9 blocks following the diagram to the right.

Sew the 9 blocks together side by side

Sew the short inner borders to the sides of the center

Sew the long inner borders to the top and bottom of the center.

Sew 2 borders to the sides.

Sew a Red Herringbone square to each end of the remaining borders.

Sew the remaining borders to the quilt.

Enjoy!

## PIECED BACKING DIRECTIONS

2.5 yds is plenty to back the quilt.

Cut a 1.5 yds piece.

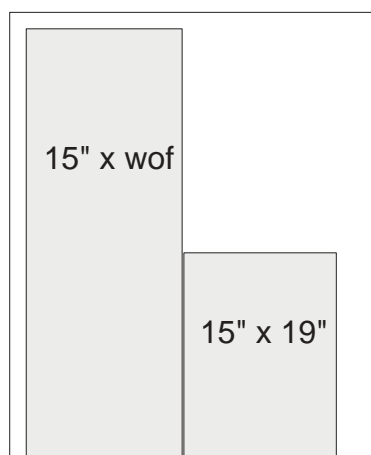
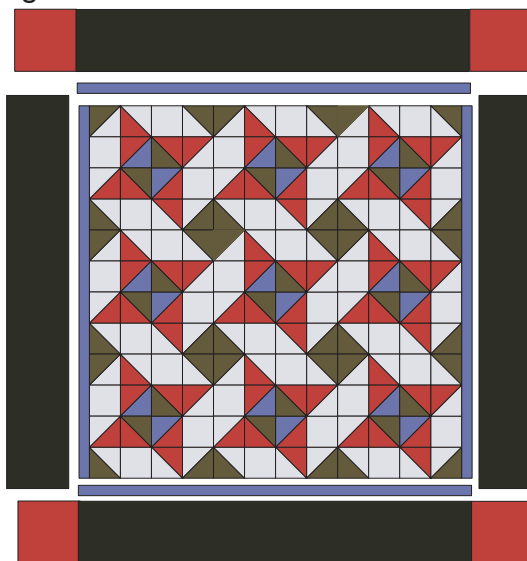
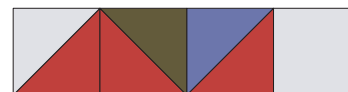
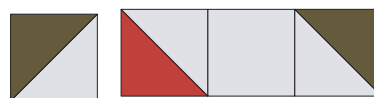
You now have a piece 1.5 yds  
and a piece 1 yd.

Following the diagram, take the 1 yd piece  
and cut a 15" wide x wof strip.

Take the remaining fabric and cut a 15" wide  
x 19" wide piece.

Sew the 2 pieces that are  
15" wide to each other.

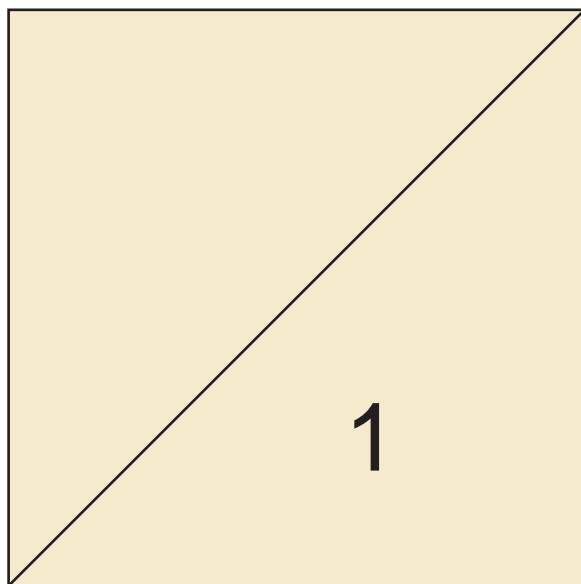
Sew these 2 long pieces to each other  
and you have a backing!



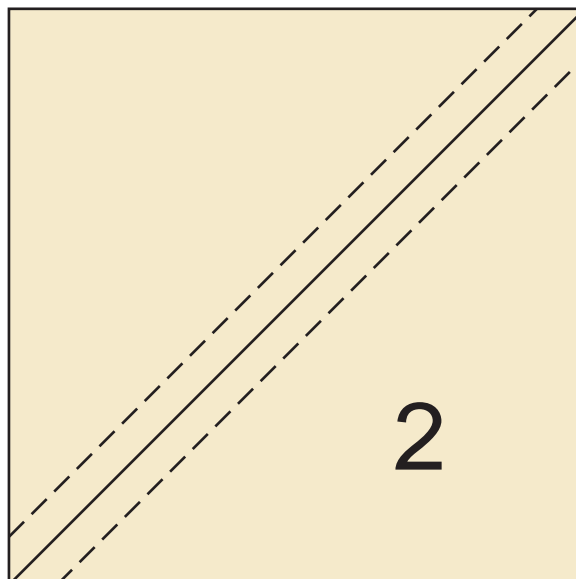
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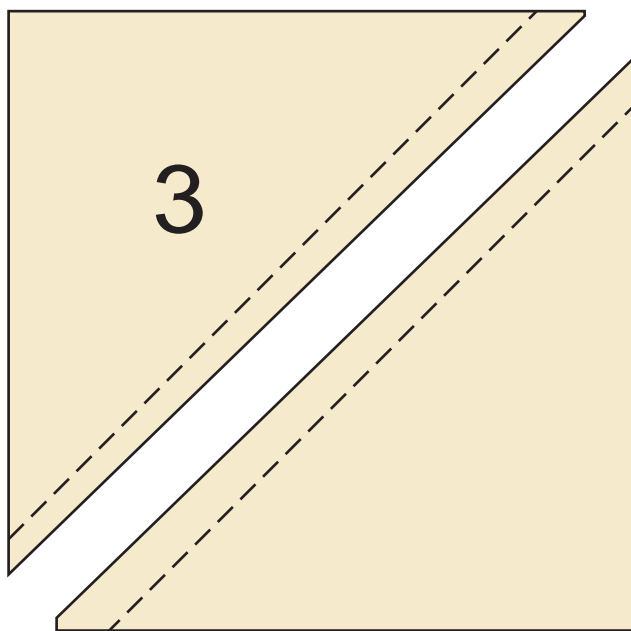
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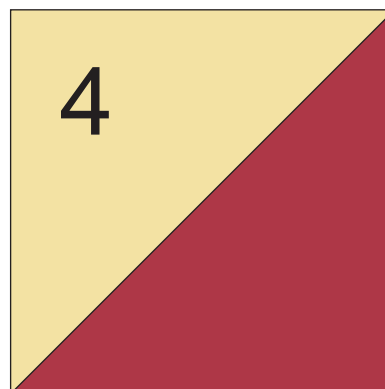
Layer 2 squares  
right sides together  
Draw a line as shown  
on the fabric



Sew a 1/4" seam  
on either side of  
the drawn line



Cut apart on the drawn line



trim to 3.5" x 3.5"
