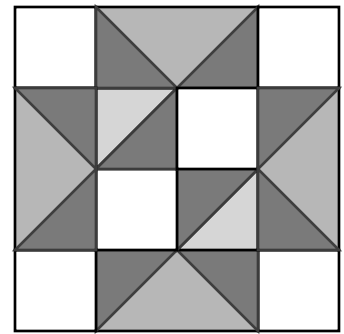
One of the wonderful ways communities come together is to help others. I'd love to hear about how you and your community have helped each other.

Block is 12.5" x 12.5"

Finished size 12" x 12"

Cutting Directions

Light fabric

-Cut 6 squares 3.5" x 3.5"

Medium Fabric

-Cut 4 rectangles 3.5" x 6.5"

-Cut 1 squares 4" x 4" for Half Square Triangles (HST)

Dark Fabric

-Cut 1 squares 4" x 4" for Half Square Triangles (HST)

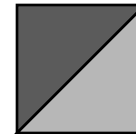
- Cut 8 squares 3.5" x 3.5"

Directions

1) Using the 4" medium and 4" dark squares make HSTs using method on the last page

Trim to 3.5" square

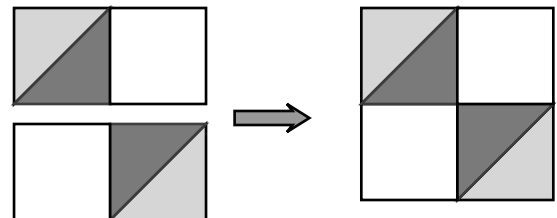
Make 2 units



2) Following the diagram, use 2 light 2.5" squares and the HST from above

Measures 6.5" x 6.5

Make 1 unit



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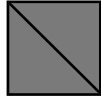
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3) Flying Geese Units

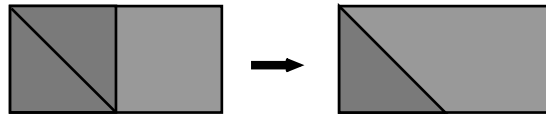
Step 1 Directions

- 1) Draw a diagonal line on each 3.5" dark square
- Make 8



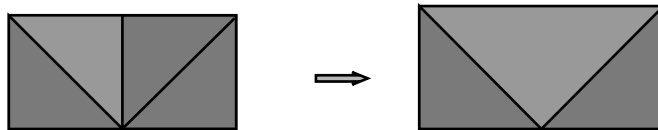
Step 2 Directions

- 1) Following the diagram, Place a dark square on the medium rectangle fabric
 - 2) Sew on the line.
 - 3) Flip over and press, check the back to be sure it matches up to the rectangle
 - 4) Trim away the excess corner fabric behind the triangle. Leave a 1/4" seam.
- 3) Make 4 Measures 3.5" x 6.5"



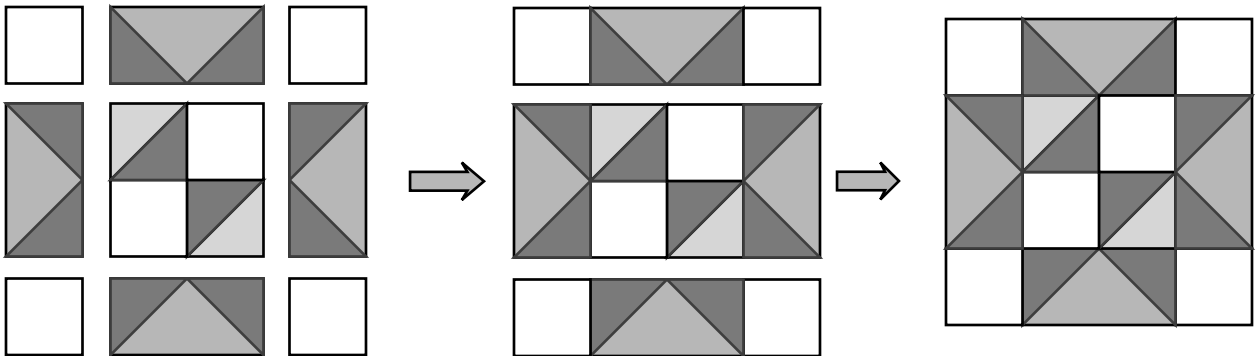
Step 3 Directions

- 1) Following the diagram, repeat step 2 for the second square to make the flying geese
- 2) Make 4
- 3) Measures 3.5" x 6.5"



Assemble Directions

- 4) Following the diagram, assemble the block using the HST, 3.5" light squares, and Flying geese from above
- Measures 12.5" x 12.5"
Make 1

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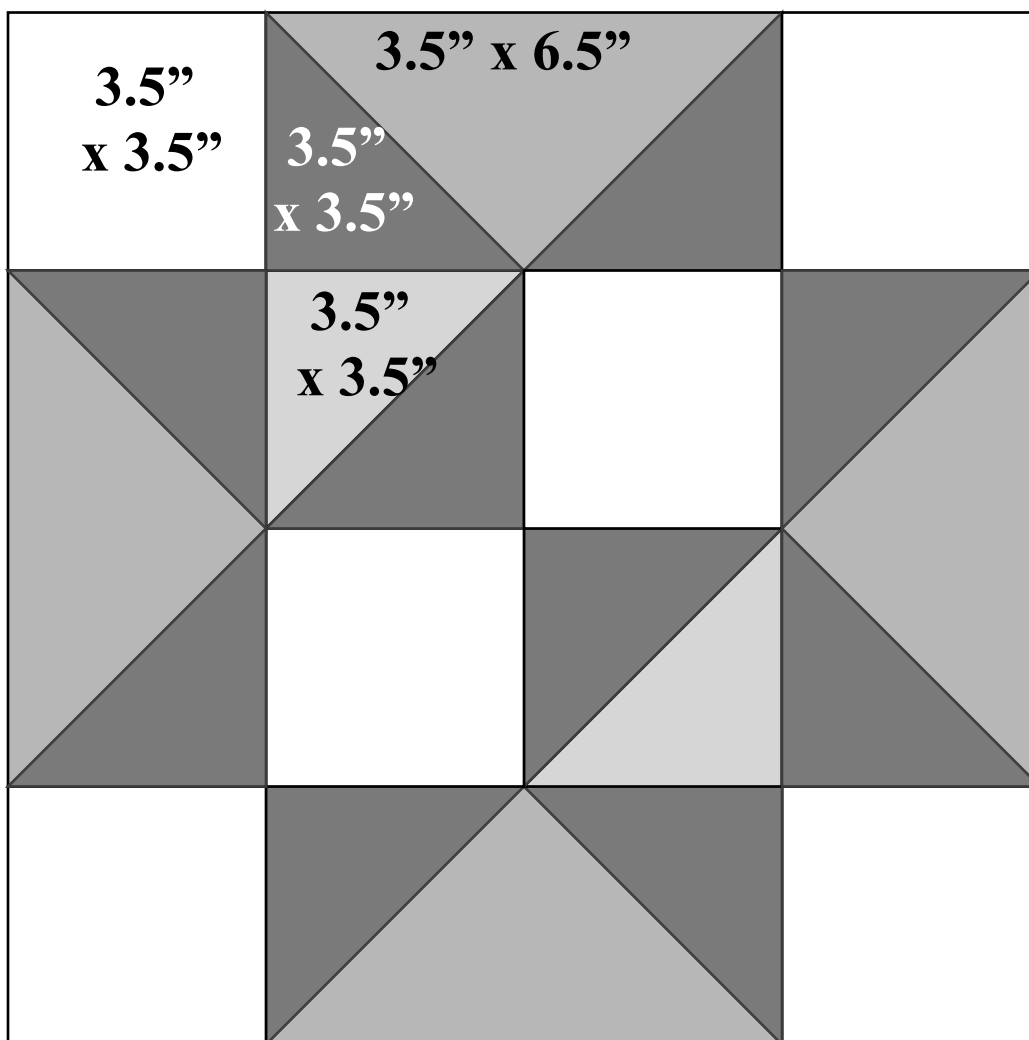

IN the Quilt it is finished size 12" x 12"

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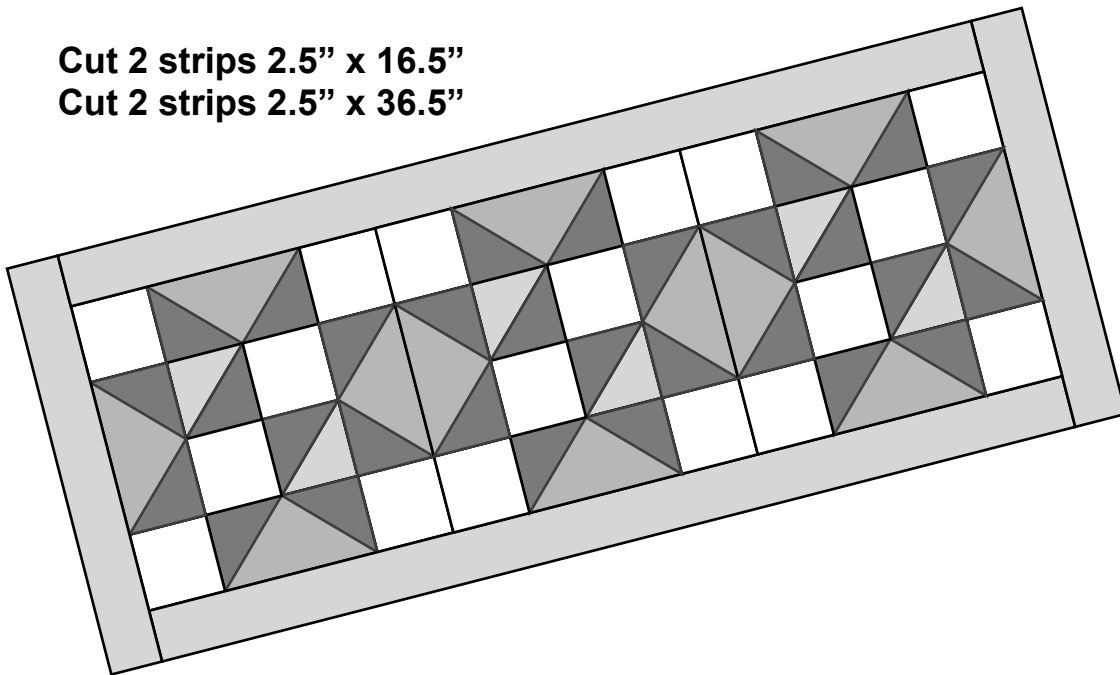
Block 12 – Charities and Projects

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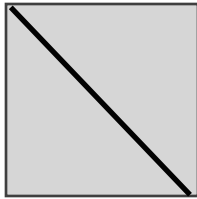
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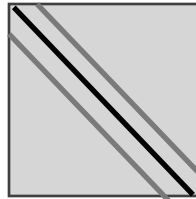
Half Square Triangles Tutorial

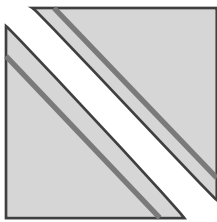
Step 1

- Draw a line on the back of all the lighter squares



Step 2

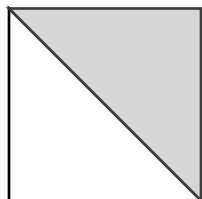
- Layer the 2 squares
- Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both Sides of the drawn line



Step 3

Cut on the drawn Line for 2 HST

Step 4



-Trim squares to 3.5" x 3.5" using a square ruler with a diagonal line placed on the Seam.
