Block 12/12 – Schools

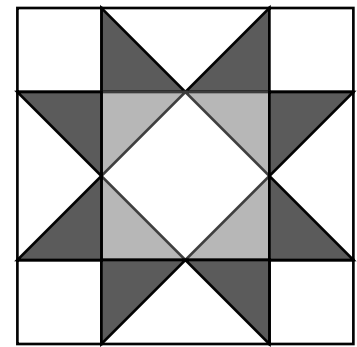

Cutting Directions

Light fabrics

- Cut 1 square 6.5" x 6.5"
- Cut 4 squares 3.5" x 3.5"
- Cut 4 strips 3.5" x 6.5"

Medium center fabric

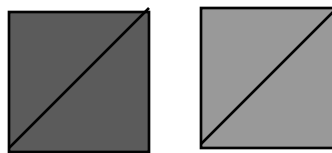
- Cut 4 square 3.5" x 3.5"

Dark Fabric

- Cut 8 square 3.5" x 3.5"

Directions - Draw lines

- 1) Following the diagram draw a diagonal line
On the back of all the medium and dark 3.5" squares
4 medium fabric
8 dark fabric

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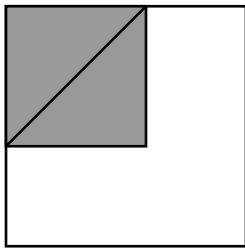
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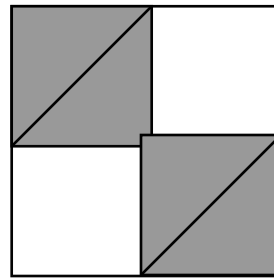

Directions - Center Square

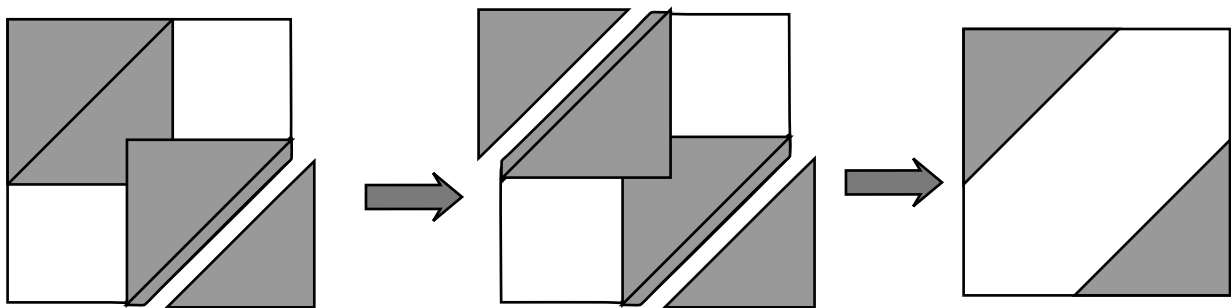
1) Following the diagram Place the Medium 3.5" square on the light 6.5" square, right sides together Sew ON the line.
Make 1



2) Following the diagram place another medium square on the light square, right sides together Sew ON the line.
Make 1

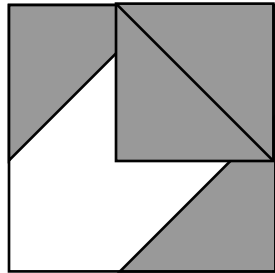


3) Following the diagram trim away leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.
Trim off both ends
Press triangles open to make a square
Measure 6.5" x 6.5"

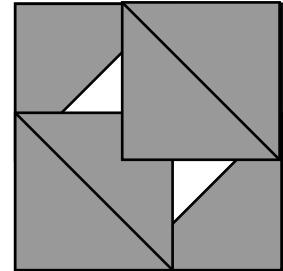


Directions - Center Square

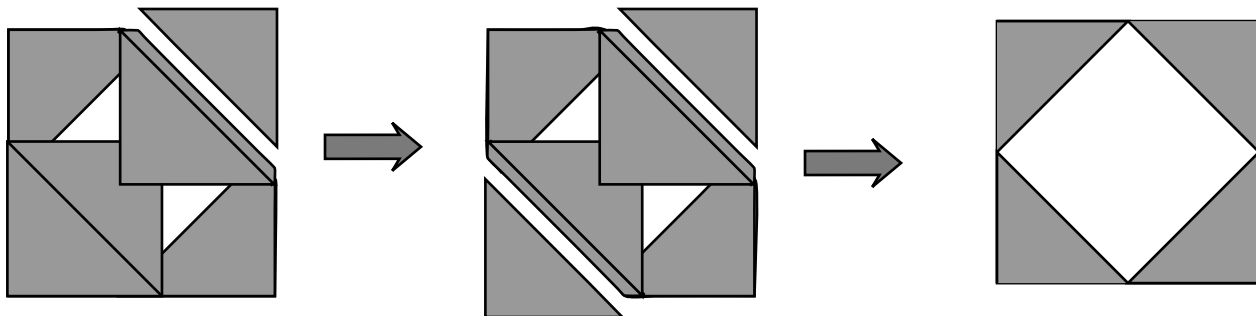
4) Following the diagram Place the medium 3.5" square on the white 6.5" square, right sides together
Sew ON the line.
Make 1



5) Following the diagram place the last medium 3.5" square on the light 6.5" square, right sides together
Sew ON the line.
Make 1



6) Following the diagram trim away leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.
Trim off both ends
Press triangles open to make a square
Measure 6.5" x 6.5"
Make 1

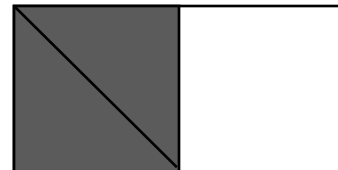


Main Street

Flying Geese Units

Step 1

- 1) Following the diagram, place a dark square on the light rectangle
- 2) Sew on the line.
- 3) Flip over and press, check the back to be sure it matches up to the rectangle
- 4) Trim away the excess corner fabric behind the triangle. Leave a 1/4" seam.



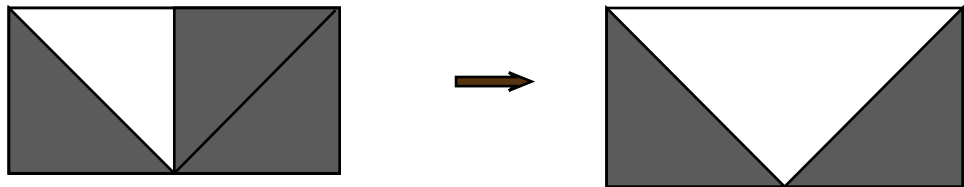
Like you did for the center

- 3) Make 4 Measures 3.5" x 6.5"

Step 2

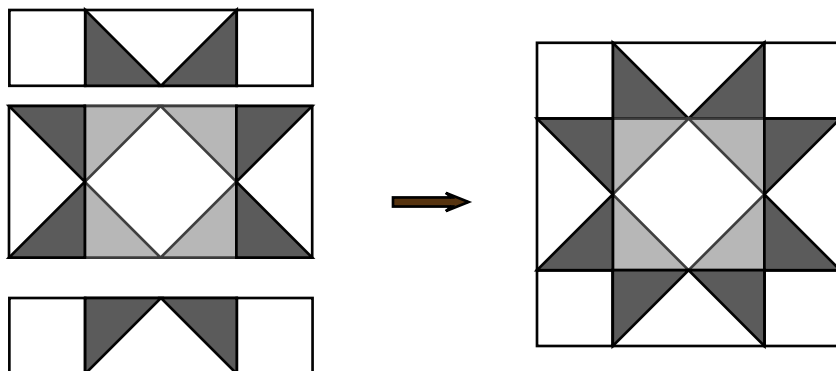
- 1) Following the diagram, repeat step 2 for the second square to make the flying geese
Make 4

Measures 3.5" x 6.5"



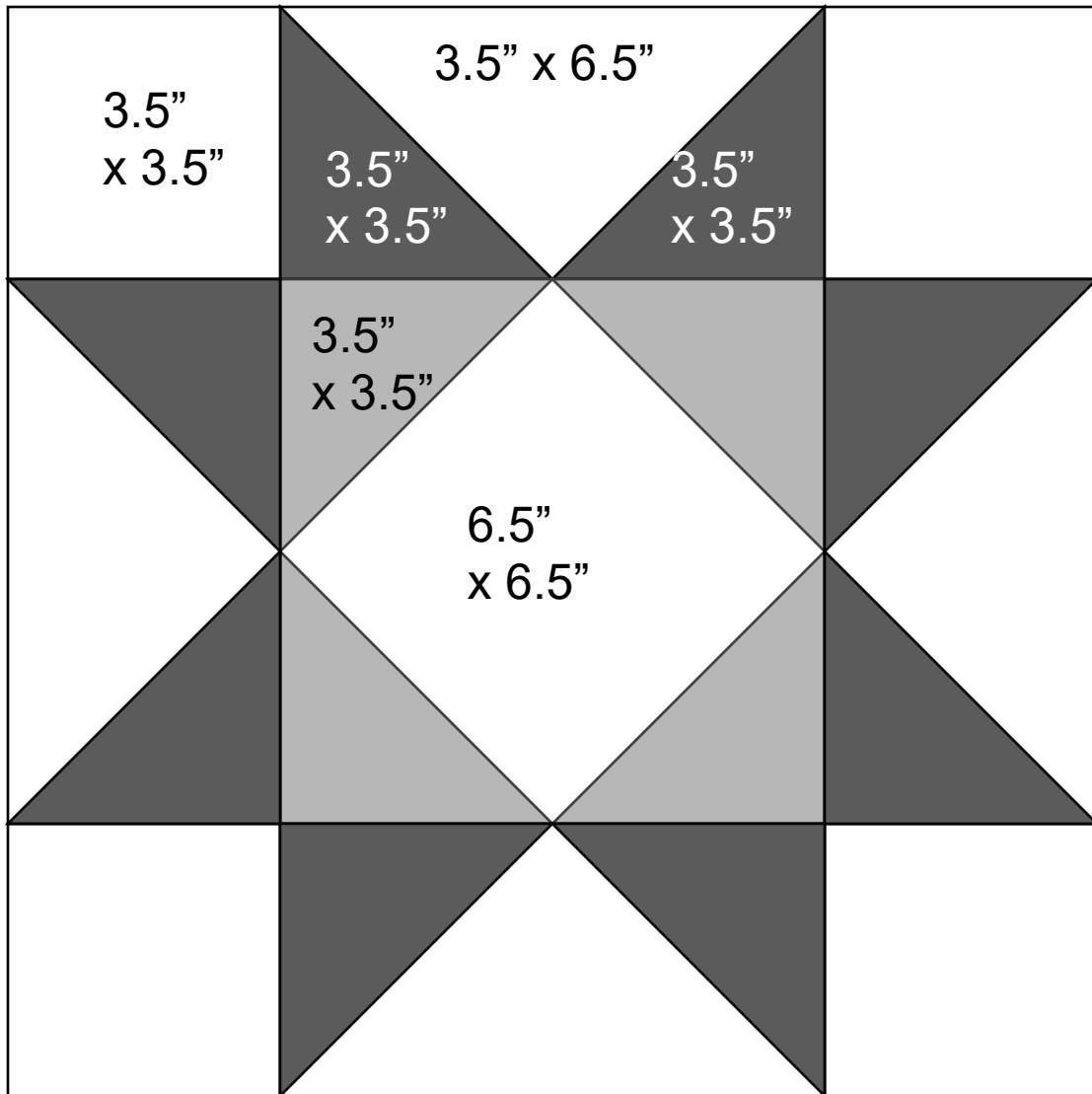
Assemble

- 1) Following the diagram, assemble the final block
Measures 12.5" x 12.5"
Make 1
