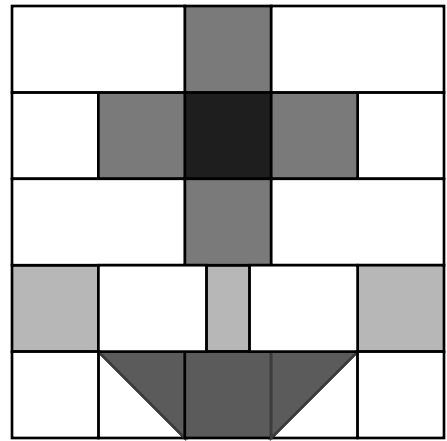

SQUARE Block to 10.5" x 10.5"

Finished in the quilt is Size 10"

Cutting & Sewing

Light Fabric

- Cut 1 square 3" x 3" for HST
- Cut 4 squares 2.5" x 2.5"
- Cut 4 rectangles 2.5" x 4.5"
- Cut 2 rectangles 2.5" x 3"

Medium Fabric 1 - flower

- Cut 4 squares 2.5" x 2.5"

Medium Fabric 2 - leaves & stem

- Cut 2 squares 2.5" x 2.5"
- Cut 1 strip 2.5" x 1.5"

Dark Fabric 1 for pot

- Cut 1 square 3" x 3" for HST
- Cut 1 square 2.5" x 2.5"

Dark Fabric 2 flower center

- Cut 1 square 2.5" x 2.5"

Directions

- 1) Sew 1 light and 1 dark 3" square Using HST method on last page. Make 2 units - trim to 2.5" square



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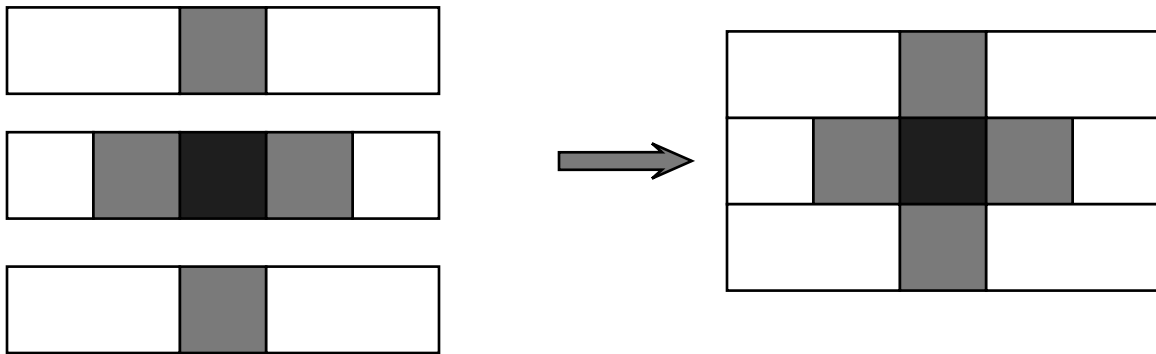

2) Following the Diagram , sew the light 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles, Medium flower squares And dark flower square together in rows

Sew the 3 strips to each other to make the flower section

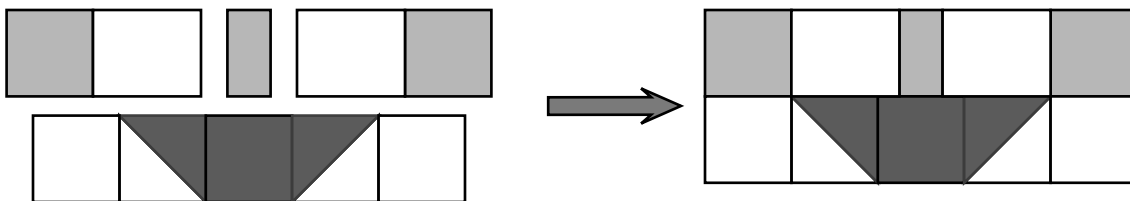
Make 1 unit - Measures 6.5" x 10.5"



3) Following the diagram sew stem strip using the 2.5" x 3" light strips and Leaf squares.

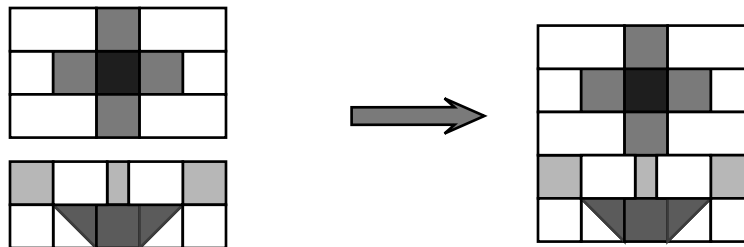
Sew the pot section using the remaining light squares, and the units for the pot
Sew the strips together.

Make 1 unit - Measures 4.5" x 10.5"



4) Sew the flower section to the leaf/pot section

Make 1 unit - Measures 10.5" x 10.5"

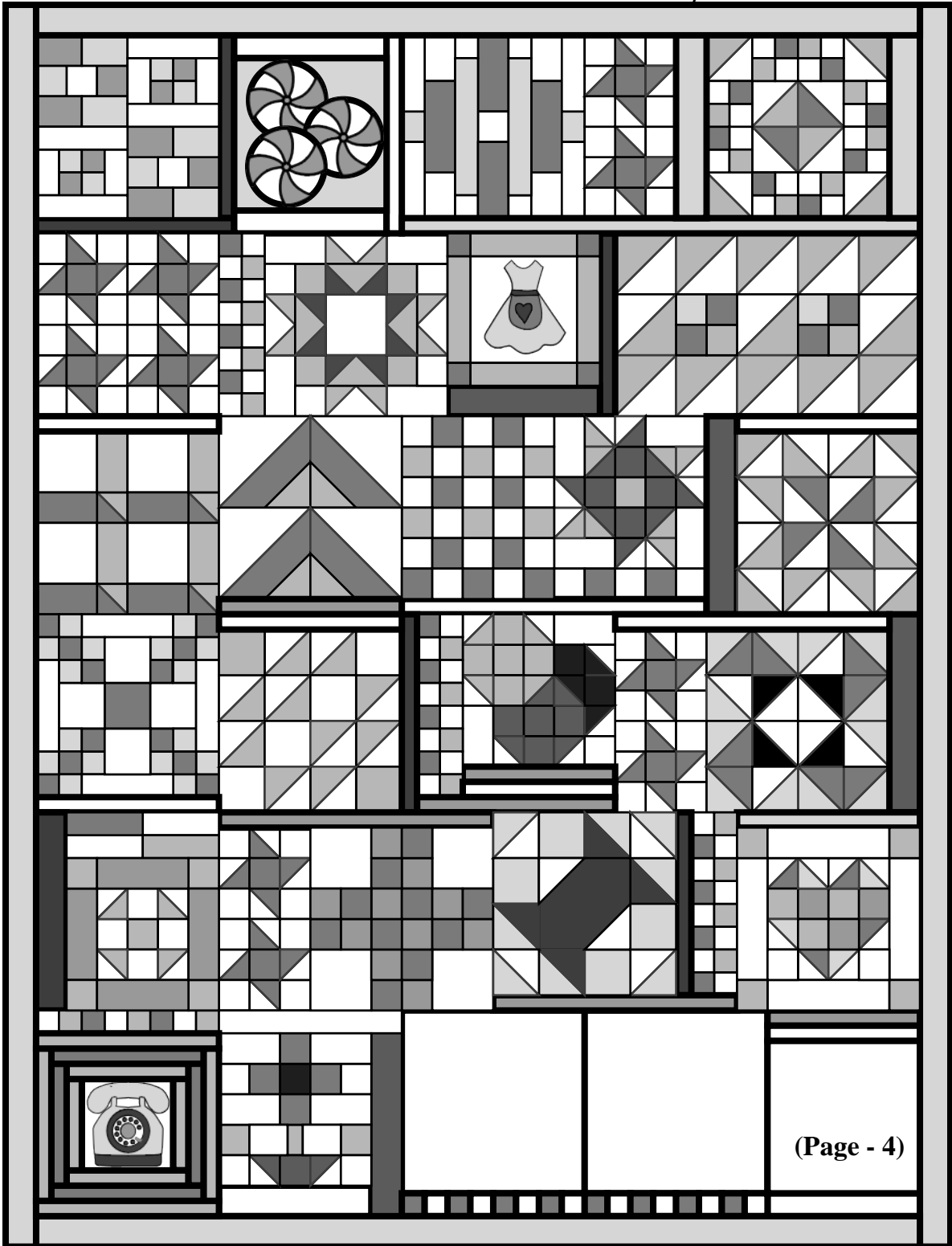
Square the Block to 10.5" x 10.5"

IN the Quilt it is finished size 10" x 10"

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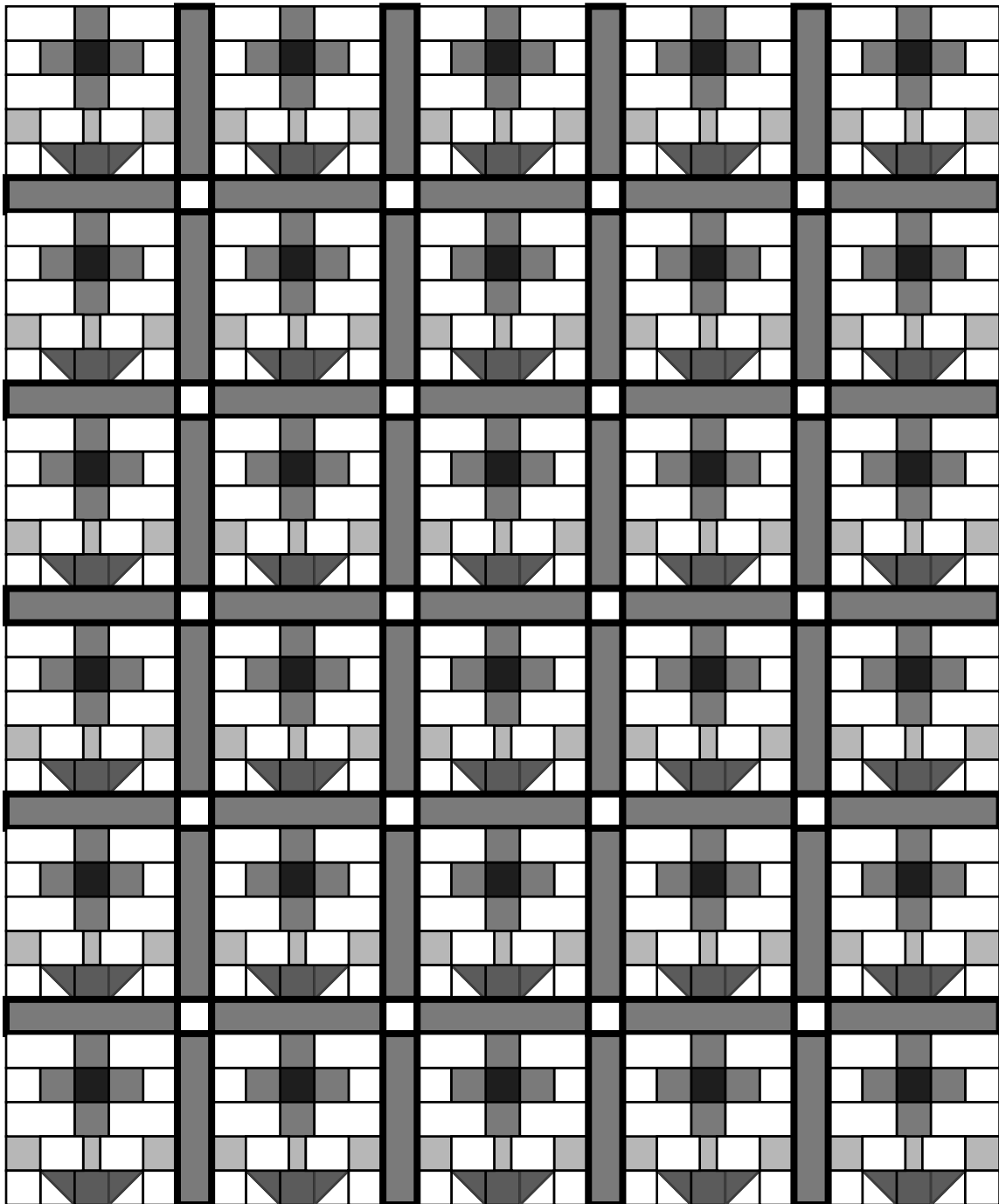


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58" x 70" quilt using 30 blocks

20 corner stones cut 2.5" x 2.5"

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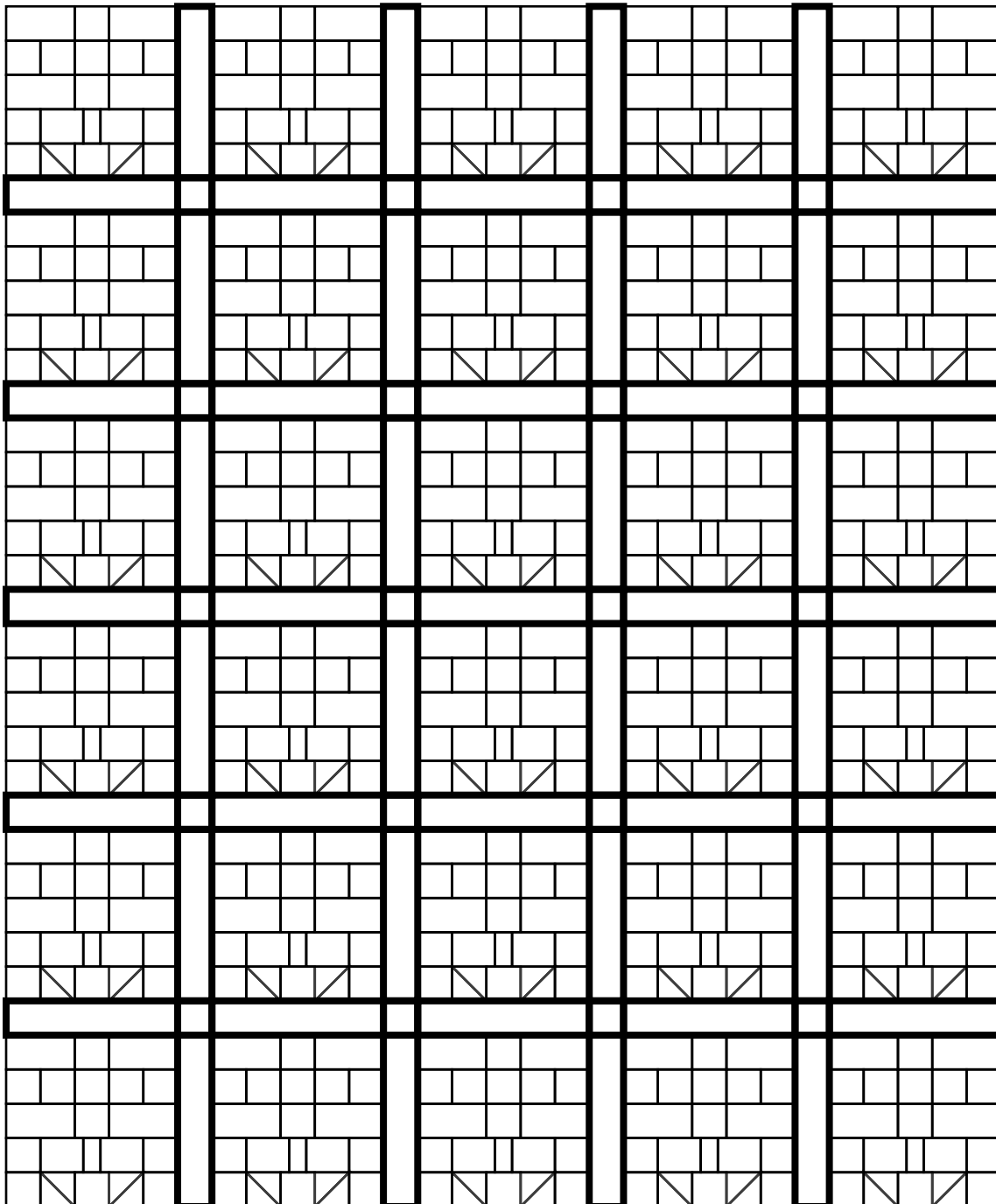
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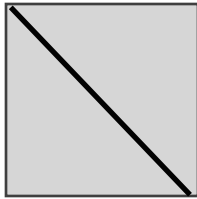

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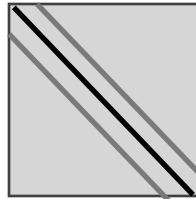
Half Square Triangles Tutorial

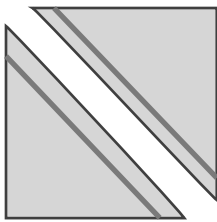
Step 1

- Draw a line on the back of all the lighter squares



Step 2

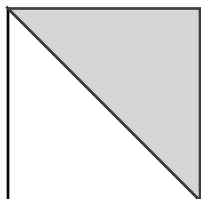
- Layer the 2 squares
- Sew a 1/4" seam on both Sides of the drawn line



Step 3

Cut on the drawn Line for 2 HST

Step 4



-Trim squares to 2.5" x 2.5" using a square ruler with a diagonal line placed on the Seam.
