Block 3/9 – Sweaters!

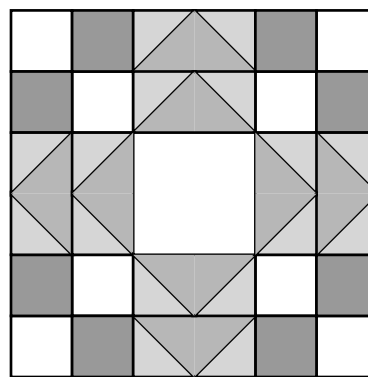

Block is 12.5" x 12.5"
Finished size 12"x 12"

Cutting & Sewing

Light 1 Fabric

- 8 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Light 2 Fabric

- 16 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

For flying geese

Medium Fabric -

- 8 rectangles 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Dark 1 Fabric

- 8 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Center Square

- 1 center square 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

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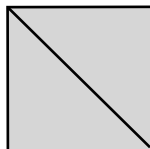
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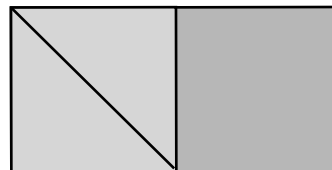
Flying Geese Units

- 1) Draw a diagonal line on each 2.5" LIGHT 2 print square
Make 16

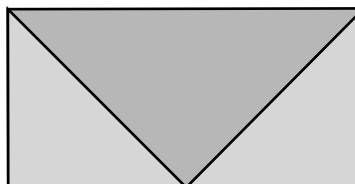
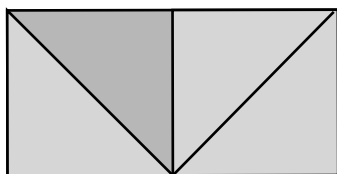


Step 2 Directions

- 1) Following the diagram, Place a square on the medium 2.5" x 4.5" rectangle
- 2) Sew on the line.
- 3) Flip over and press, check the back to be sure it matches up to the rectangle
- 4) Trim away the excess corner fabric behind the triangle. Leave a 1/4" seam.
- 3) Make 8 Measures 2.5" x 4.5"



- 3) Following the diagram, repeat step 2 for the second square to make the flying geese
Make 8
Measures 2.5" x 4.5"

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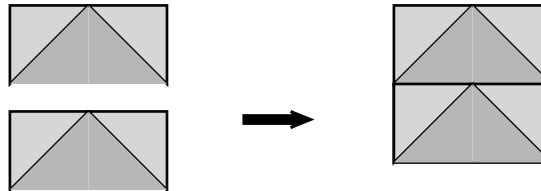

Directions

4) Following the diagram sew 2 flying geese blocks together

Make 4

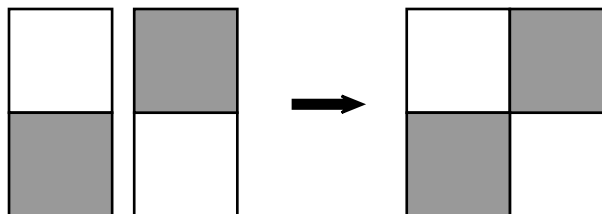
measures 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"



5) Following the diagram sew 2 light 1 and dark 1 squares into a 4-patch

Make 4

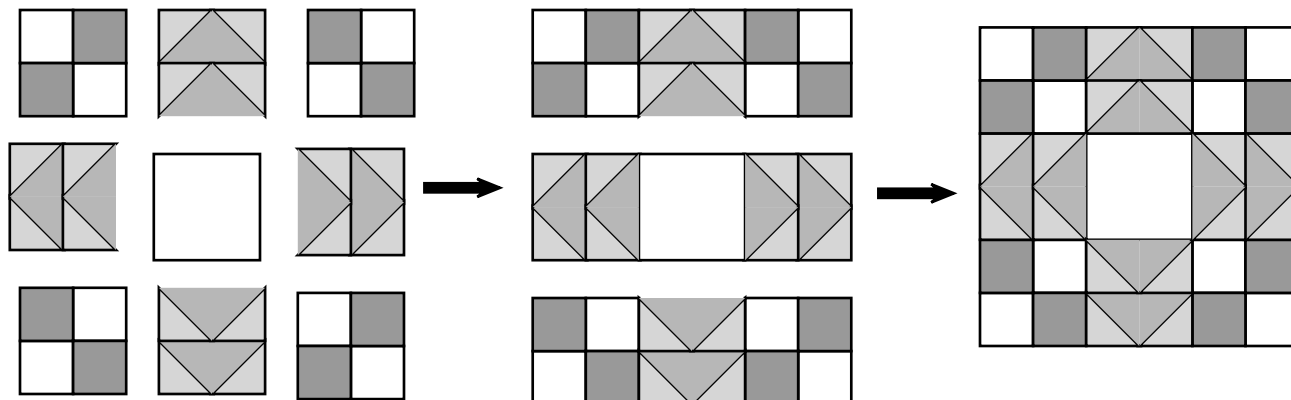
measures 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"



6) Following the diagram sew the block

Make 1

measures 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"



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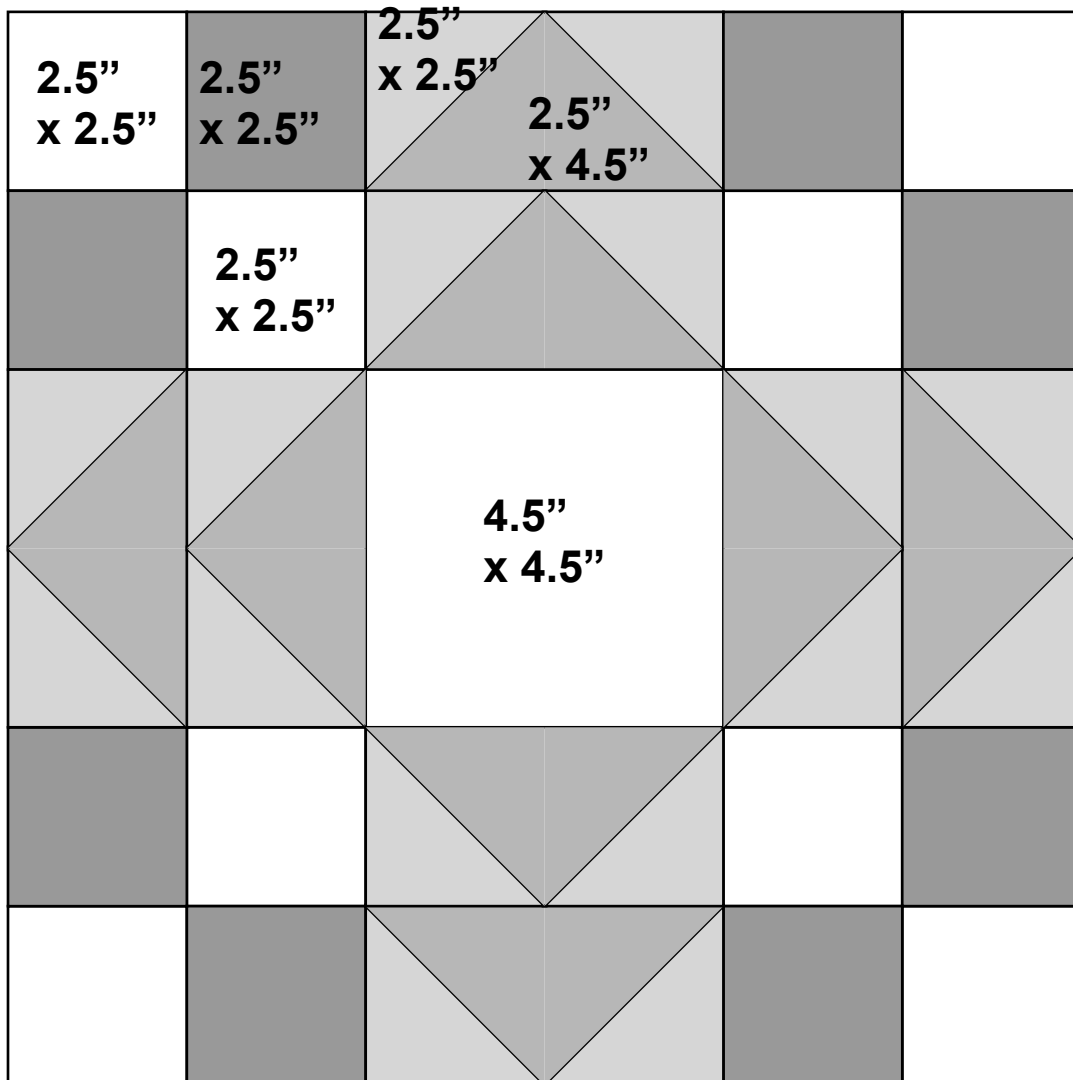

IN the Quilt it is finished size 12" x 12"

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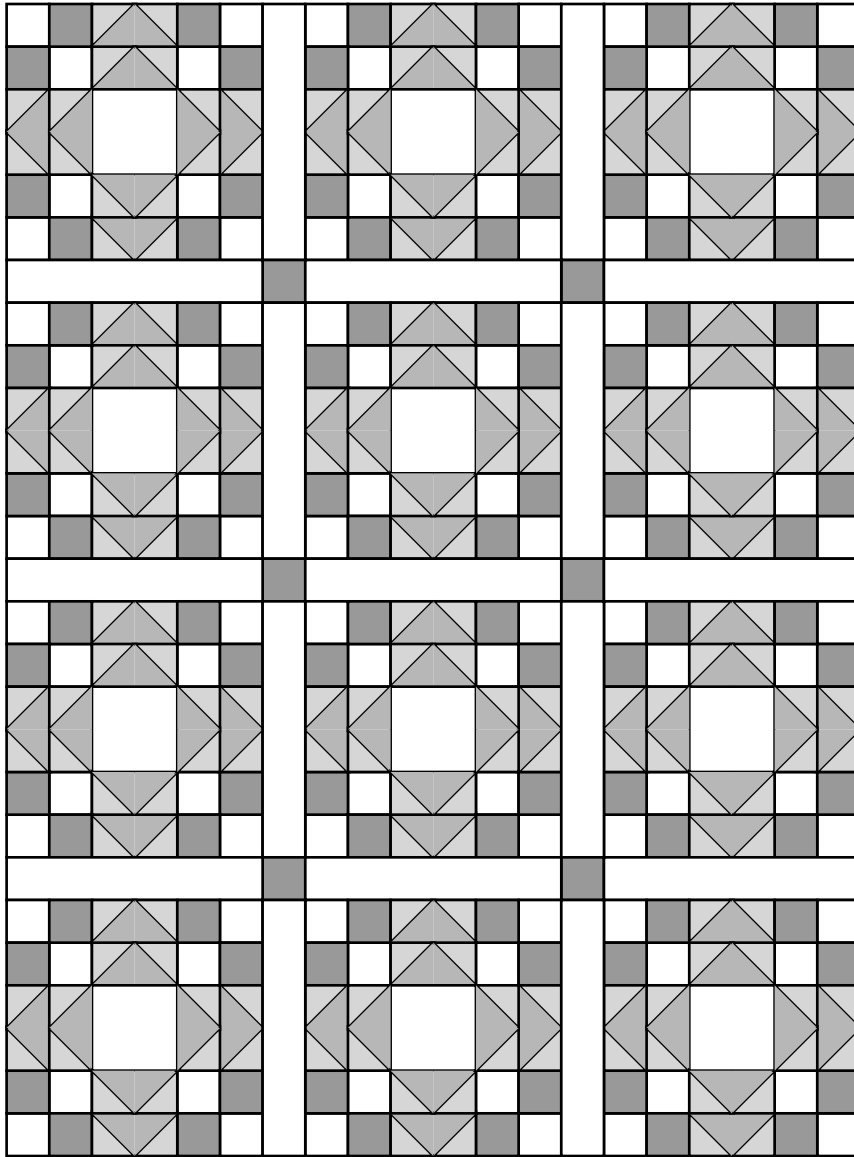
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BONUS Layout

12 Blocks cut 6 squares 2.5" x .25"

Cut 17 strips 2.5" x 12.5"

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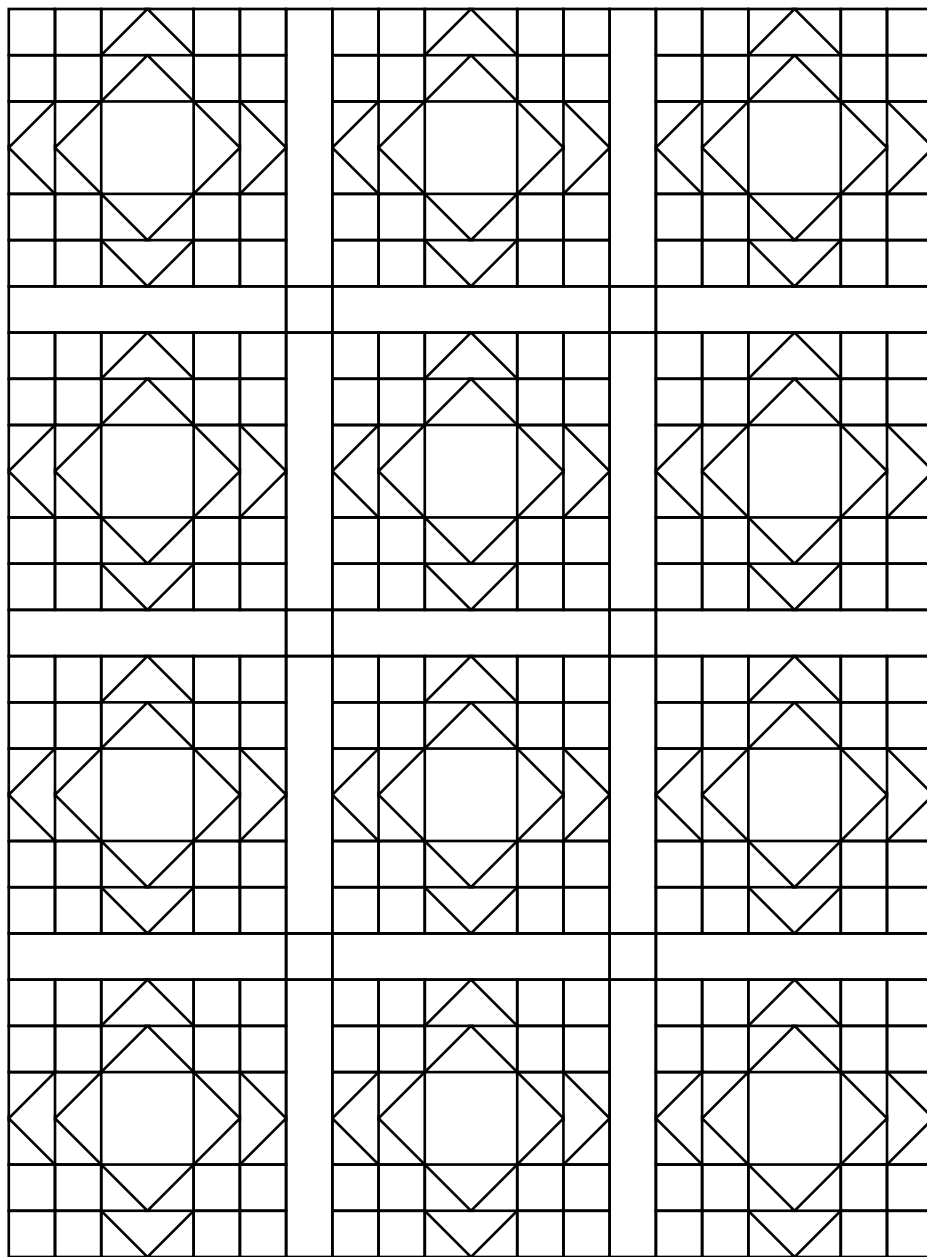

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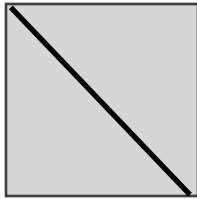
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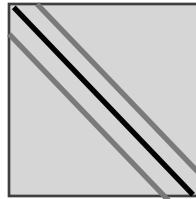
Half Square Triangles Tutorial

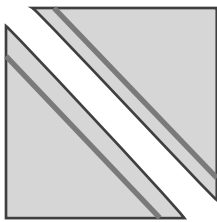
Step 1

- Draw a line on the back of all the lighter squares



Step 2

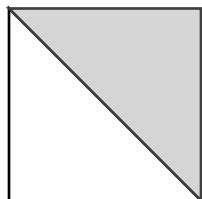
- Layer the 2 squares
- Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both Sides of the drawn line



Step 3

Cut on the drawn Line for 2 HST

Step 4



-Trim squares to size using a square ruler with a diagonal line placed on the Seam.
