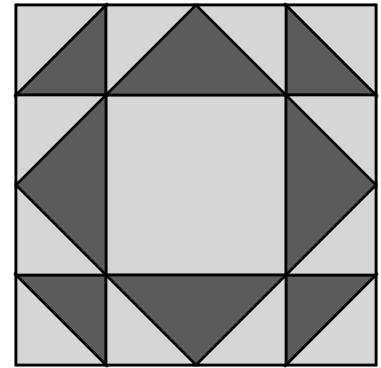
Block 7 – Badminton

Block is 12.5" x 12.5"
Finished size 12" x 12"

Cutting Directions

Medium fabrics

- Cut 2 squares 4" x 4" for HST (HST - Half Square Triangle)
- Cut 8 squares 3.5" x 3.5"
- Cut 1 square 6.5" x 6.5"

Dark Fabric

- Cut 2 squares 4" x 4" for HST
- Cut 4 rectangles 3.5" x 6.5"

Directions

1) Using the 4" medium and the 4" dark fabric squares make HSTs using method on the last page

trim to 3.5" square
Make 4 units

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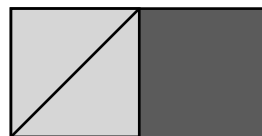
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Directions

2) Following the diagram place the medium square on the corner of the dark rectangle
Sew ON the line.

Make 4

Measures 3.5" x 6.5"

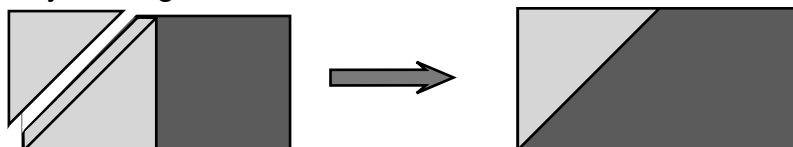


3) Following the diagram trim away leaving a 1/4" seam allowance

Press triangle open

Make 4

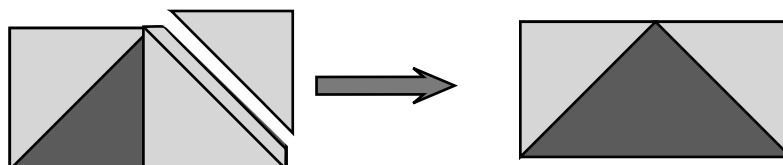
Measures 3.5" x 6.5"



4) Repeat step 2 and 3 sewing a 3.5" medium square on the other end

Make 4

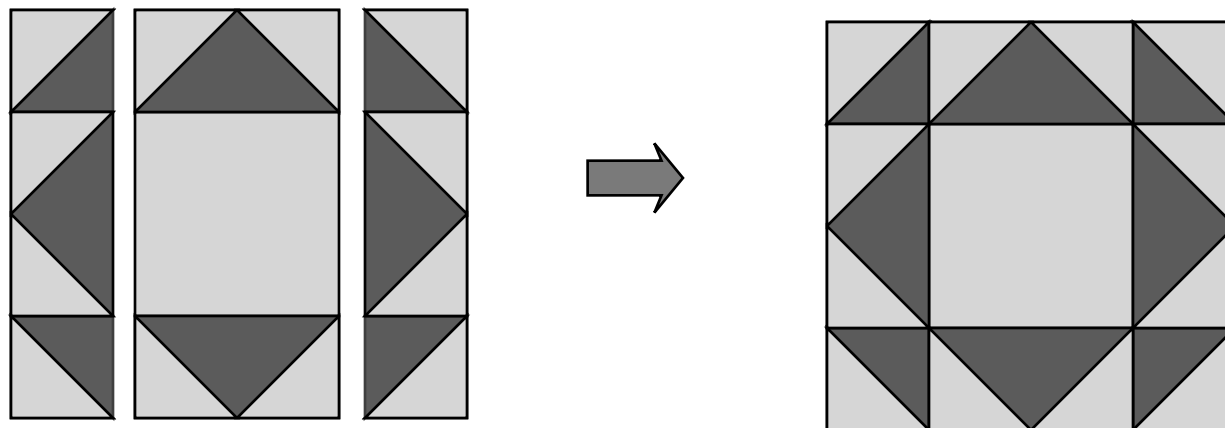
Measures 3.5" x 6.5"



5) Following the diagram, Assemble the 6.5" medium square, the HST units, and the Flying geese units.

Make 1

Measures 12.5" x 12.5"

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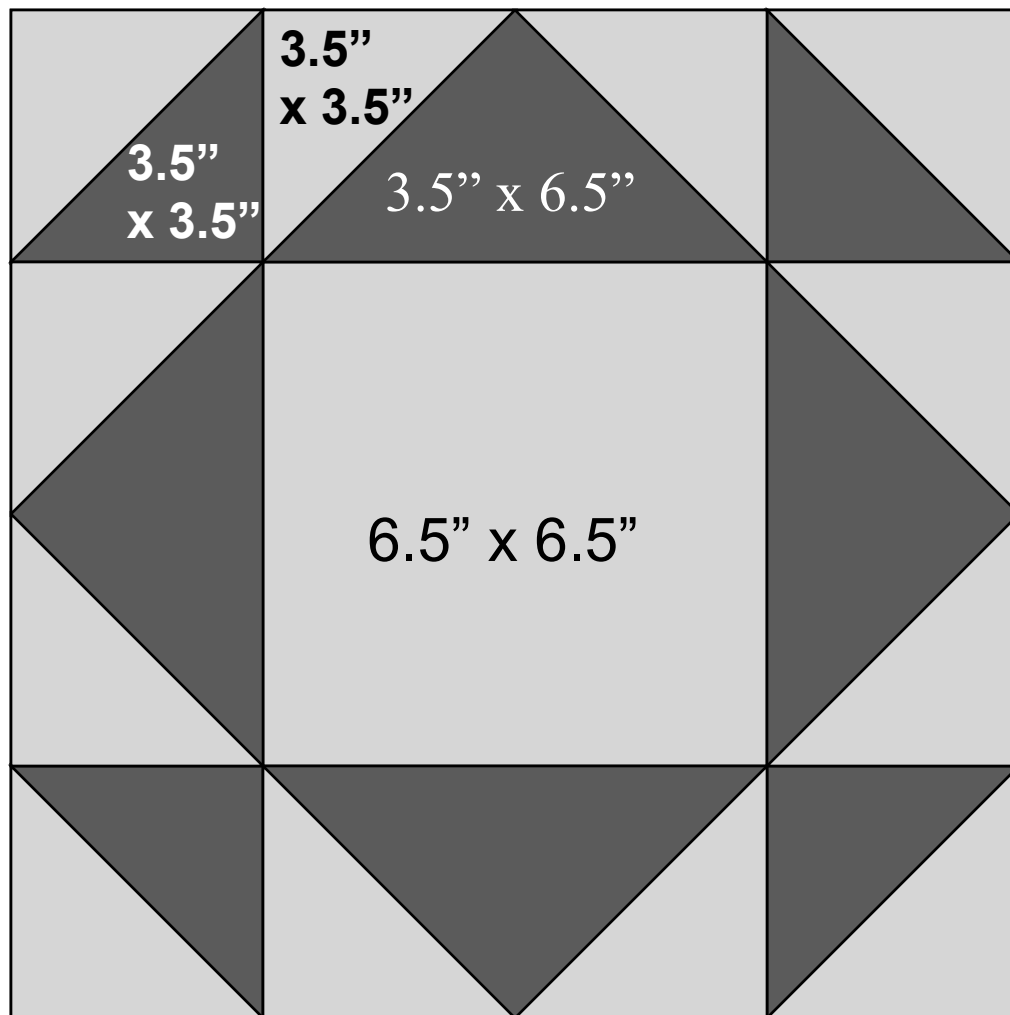

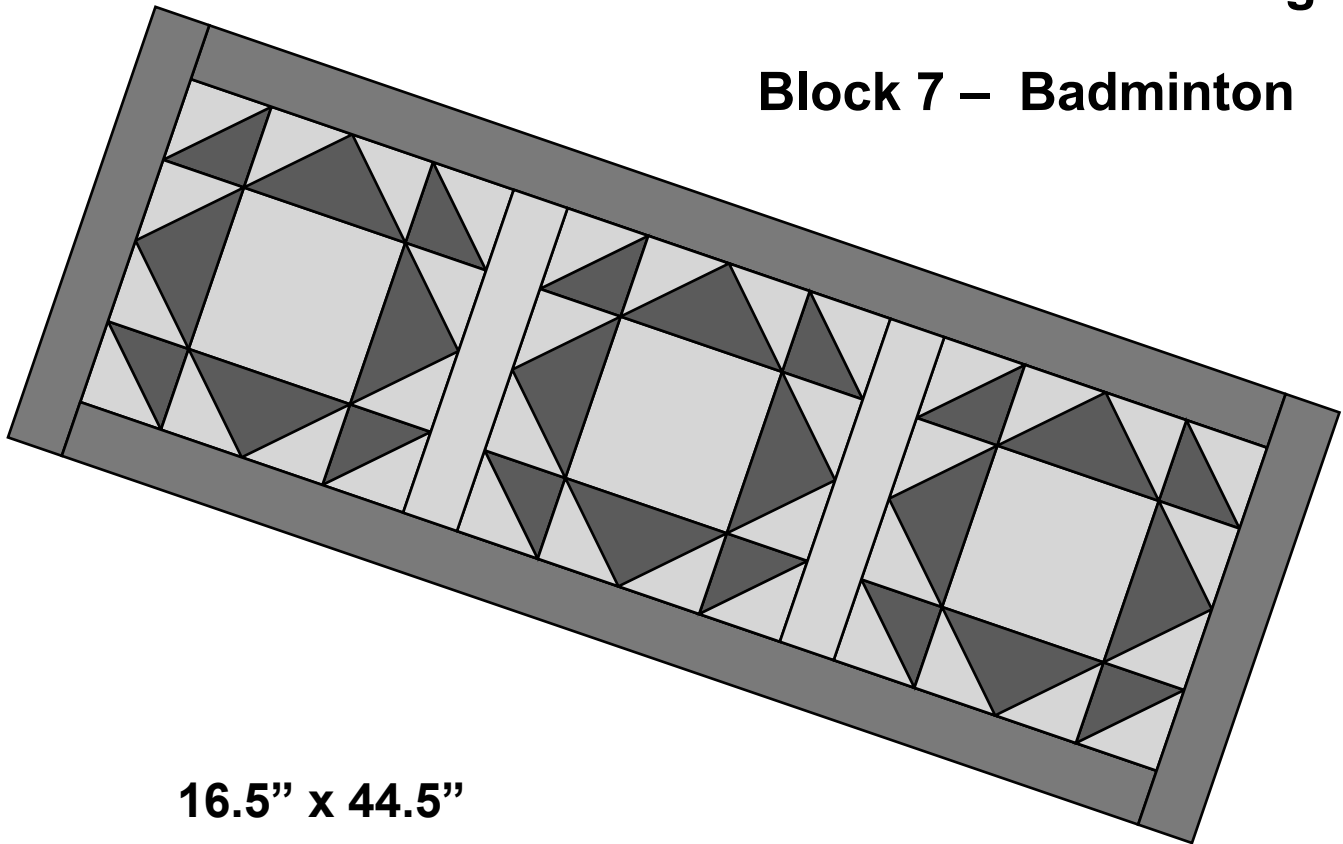

3 Blocks

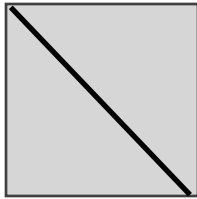
Cut 2 sashing 2.5" x 12.5"

Cut 2 borders 2.5" x 16.5"

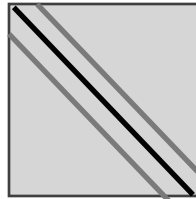
Half Square Triangles Tutorial

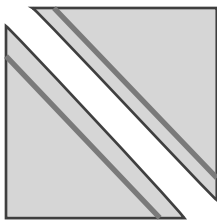
Step 1

- Draw a line on the back of all the lighter squares



Step 2

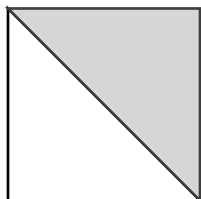
- Layer the 2 squares
- Sew a 1/4" seam on both Sides of the drawn line



Step 3

Cut on the drawn Line for 2 HST

Step 4



-Trim squares to size needed using a square ruler with a diagonal line placed on the Seam.
